HOW IT WORKS

Developed over the past 50 years, Ortho-K has gained wide recognition as a safer and less expensive alternative to LASIK refractive surgery. Ortho-K lenses are designed for people of all ages to temporarily eliminate myopia, hyperopia, astigmatism, and presbyopia. Most exciting, it is used to control the progression of myopia in children and teens.
